GOVERNANCE

we will

- Introduce an Elected Senate in 2009 if approved by the people
- Seek National Assembly approval for all major investment agreements with Government
- Abolish appeals to the Privy Council and replace it with a right of appeal to the Caribbean Court of Justice
- Further strengthen the Finance and Audit Reform Act to increase accountability and impose sanctions for violations
- Appoint a Constitutional Reform Commission to review the Constitution to make it more people-friendly, more relevant and recognize the new local and international developments in constitutional law and human rights
- Create an Indigenous People's Rights Commission to study and make recommendations arising from the landmark Supreme Court judgment
- Continue to strengthen the National Association of Village Councils
- Establish a Gender Institute to implement the Women's Agenda to promote gender equality in governance, health sector, education and economic opportunities

ECONOMY

- Establish an agency for effective consumer protection to address the cost of living especially food and utility rates
- Reduce import duties
- · Provide a tax relief for mortgage, rent and student loan payments
- · Abolish Land Tax on small farms of 25 acres or less
- Additionally provide mortgage, rent and student loan deduction from income tax

- Establish a well funded Belize Development Bank to provide affordable finance and export credits to the productive sector with a special facility for micro-credit to Belizeans
- Promote investments in new growth areas: Fresh flowers for export, Biotechnology and health food industries, marine farming, organic fruits and vegetables and ICT
- Facilitate the creation of 5000 new jobs in the Tourism industry, 5000 new jobs in ICT industries, 5,000 jobs in agriculture and mariculture, 5000 new jobs in the petroleum and energy related industries
- Complement the job-creation strategy with a strong skills training and apprenticeship programs in handicraft, ICT, and other relevant skills
- Formulate a National Youth Employment Policy that will provide incentives for businesses that employ and respect to the rights of young people
- Provide salary increases for teachers, nurses, police officers, BDF soldiers, Coast Guard members and other public officers
- Establish Economic Empowerment and Enterprise Zones in urban areas, Greater Ladyville, Independence/Big Creek Toledo, Western Border Benque Viejo del Carmen and Santa Elena Corozal
- Significantly increase Air Cargo services
- Complete the implementation of the ASYCUDA system in the Customs to improve efficiency and equity and to vigorously fight against organized large-scale contraband
- Use technology to enable the making of payments and applications to government
- Establish within first 30 days of re-election COST OF DOING BUSINESS IN BELIZE COMMISSION mandated to study the costs of doing business in Belize with special emphasis on the productive sector and be required to report with recommendations within 6 months.

CRIME & JUSTICE

- Increase the use of security cameras in hot spots and sensitive areas
- Recruit 800 new police officers and staff and equip police substations in major villages around the country
- Significantly strengthen the Community Policing Initiatives including Neighbourhood Watches and 'Get A Life' programmes
- Allow witnesses to legally testify without disclosing their identity in special circumstances whilst strengthening the Witness Protection Programme
- Enact legislation to establish an independent Citizens Complaint Bureau to address allegations of abuse by security forces
- Continue to collaborate with friendly governments and agencies in the fight against human and narco-trafficking
- Fully implement the alternative sentencing laws and increase the use of community service orders where appropriate including for minor drug offences
- · Double the number of trained crime scene experts and place at least one in each district
- Complete the equipping of the Forensics Lab to enable full DNA analysis and bring online the ballistics registry
- Regionalize the Supreme Court and Family Court with permanent courts in Dangriga, Belmopan City and Orange Walk Town



- Increase the digitization of births, deaths and marriage registries and decentralize access to the records
- Reform the judicial system new rules in the magistrates' courts, more use of information technology in courts and introduce by law accountability in the judiciary
- Significantly strengthen the office of the DPP and police prosecution department to increase the rate of convictions

- · Build a new library in Belmopan
- Build a modern new Archives facility in Belmopan
- Significantly expand the free textbooks programme to include high school
- Immediately guarantee free universal access to high school education
- Provide one free laptop computer for each student in upper-primary and secondary school
- Achieve 75% trained teachers by 2010
- Ensure average class size of 25 students by 2010
- Provide free public pre-school for all needy children
- Deepen the integration of special needs students into mainstream classes
- · Expand nutritional feeding programs in primary schools where needed
- Provide a CXC exam credit of 50% per subject
- Increase teachers' salaries and ensure that Government assumes responsibility for 100% of teachers' salaries
- · Establish new history and anthropology departments at University of Belize

- Establish a Culture Heritage Pension Fund to support artists who have contributed significantly to Belizean History and Culture
- · Establish an Art Fund to give micro credit to innovative and creative culture projects

- Abolish GST on more medicines including all generic drugs
- Promote a Healthy Lifestyle Campaign which has a holistic focus on mental and physical well being
- Expand and strengthen NHI to ensure free primary health care for all Belizeans at point of delivery
- Continue to provide FREE anti-retroviral medication and enhance the fight against HIV/AIDS by introducing a SAVE campaign (Safer practices, Accessibility and availability of anti-retroviral medication, Voluntary services and Empowerment)
- Continue Health Sector reform upgrade regional hospitals with a view to having surgeries in all district hospitals
- Provide scholarships and train 500 more nurses and take measures to encourage nurses to remain in Belize
- Provide scholarships for students to study psychology, psychiatry and counseling
- Strengthen Public Health to ensure we maintain and improve our health statistics and reduce our STI's
- · Open the Mental Health Facility in Belmopan
- Further strengthen KHMH and increase its level of care as it continues to be the leading health care facility in the country
- Ensure that all health facilities are well resourced and staffed 24/7

- Encourage and facilitate investment in an additional 2,500 hotel rooms
- Establish Tourism and Hospitality departments at ITVET

LAND & HOUSING



- Guarantee mortgage payments do not exceed \$200 for low-income Government houses
- · Convert all leases of government houses to title to the tenant after paying 15 years rent
- Use the PETROCARIBE housing fund to provide loans at 2% for housing and home improvement
- Create a Survey Bureau to make surveys quicker and more affordable
- Facilitate private sector led housing estates
- Strengthen the Lands Registry and Land Titles Unit to increase efficiency and reliability
- Accelerate the completion of the Lease to Title Initiative by issuing thousands of titles in public ceremonies
- Establish a facility to grant a lot to each Belizean UB graduate who does not yet own land
- Continue to modernize the Lands department to re-engineer its processes in order that the issuing of land titles is easier
- Make access to owning a house lot for all Belizeans straightforward and de-politicized
- Assist single parents and newly-weds to obtain a house with very low mortgage payments
- Home Improvement assistance to be made available to the needy
- Work with financial institutions and developers to create innovative financing packages, including rent-to-buy schemes and reverse mortgages for responsible seniors
- Support the use of new modular and other construction technology to lower costs of new housing
- Develop requirements for housing developers to include affordable housing components as part of larger housing projects

- Continue to provide support to Belize's major industries of sugar, citrus, banana and marine products industries

- Promote Research and Development in the fauna of Belize for the health and wellness industry




- · Promote the development of the rum, wine and spirits industry for export
- · Encourage the private sector to build a cement and fertilizer factory in Belize
- Ensure that the benefits from co-generation by BELCOGEN and bio-fuel industries are enjoyed by sugar cane farmers and their families
- Strongly support the farming of vegetables such as carrots, potatoes, onions, celery, mushrooms etc. for local consumption
- Strongly promote the expansion of caged fish farming and land-based fish-farming
- Encourage and promote niche industries such as organic farming and new options such as FAIRTRADE

- Provide next generation options for fishing coops growing seaweed, fish-farming and caged farming

- Establish a national boxing program and encourage community sporting clubs

- Free bus passes to all persons 65 years and over
- Expand compassionate care for the homeless remove them from the streets and into dignified shelters

- Finance a major upgrade in farm roads countrywide especially sugar roads using EU funds
- · Continue implementation of the Southside Renewal Project
- Invest \$50 million on drains and roads in municipalities



- Continue to improve the national road network including Placencia and Hopkins, Progresso to Copperbank and to Sarteneja, Orange Walk Town to Blue Creek, the Manatee Road, from Remate to Louisville cut-off, from Julian Cho High School to Jalacte and Valley of Peace roads to be paved
- Achieve 100% nationwide electrification
- Complete the rural water supply project by building a water system in every village
- · Pave all roads passing through villages
- Replace all ferries nationwide with bridges and a new bridge over the Haulover Creek/Belize River
- Add a managed traffic lane between Belize City and Ladyville
- · Build a new road from Belize City to the PGIA
- Safer highways introduce speed cameras, more speed bumps, pedestrian crossings, reflectors and painted lines on the highways

- Adopt a new national policy and strategy to meet the challenges of Climate Change
- Encourage BELCOGEN and other clean fuel sources
- Eliminate duty on energy-saving products such as energy-saving bulbs, solar or photovoltaic energy-generating systems
