OVER SIX YEARS ON THE RUN, ACCUSED MURDERER MELVIN SALAZAR TURNS HIMSELF IN TO THE POLICE

SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, Wednesday, April 28, 2010:

After being on the run for over 6 years; at around 10 o'clock this Wednesday morning, accused murderer Melvin Salazar, 29, accompanied by a San Ignacio Justice of the Peace, walked up the steps of the San Ignacio police station and handed himself in.

Melvin Salazar, 23 at the time, stands

accused of the December 16, 2004 chopping death of Ermildo "Cha-kiste" Coc, also 23 at that time, of a Thornley Street address in San Ignacio Town.

At the time of the incident, Salazar and Coc were working on a construction site at Barton Creek Farm on the Mountain Pine Ridge Road near the village of Georgeville. Salazar

began working on the site a mere 6 days prior to the incident. He reportedly left home at around 9:00 am on December 14 to collect his pay and that was the last time relatives saw him until 2 days later when he was detained by the police shortly after the incident.

The injured Ermildo Coc, with multiple chop wounds to head, face and chest was transported to the San Ignacio Town Hospital where he was officially pronounced dead.

Western Highway Jackings Resurfacing

SANTA ELENA TOWN, Cayo, Thursday, April 29, 2010:

The late night/early morning Santa Elena Town jackings, on that stretch of the Western Highway between the Hawksworth Bridge and Carillo Puerto Avenue is on an apparent comeback.

Many of these cases go unreported because the victim is either embarrassed to lodge a formal complaint as in most cases they are drunk and are attacked as they stagger down the highway on their way home or because the items taken from them are considered minimal in value with the items of choice

for the jackers being cellular telephones and jewelry. Victims in these circumstances rarely carry large sums of money as in many cases those staggering down the highway might have spent most if not all their money on the booze and not leaving a least a little cash for the taxi ride back home.

One such reported instance occurred at around 4:00 am on Thursday, April 29. Jaime Requena, 37, Belizean Park Ranger of a Western Highway, Santa Elena Town address reported that he was on his way home and upon reaching in front of Joe's Cool Spot Club,

Just as swiftly as he was detained, arrested and formally charged for murder, in similar fashion Salazar escaped from police custody. He was reportedly awaiting transportation to the Belize Central Prison and while the cell block was going through the usual morning cleaning process, Salazar reportedly bolted out of the station and instead of running across the Hawksworth bridge, he swam across the Macal river and that was the last time the police saw him.

Now that he is in police custody, Salazar informed that he spent 2 years in Mexico but was too far away from his family and so he relocated to Santa Elena, Peten, Guatemala. Whilst in Guatemala he was robbed and in the process he was shot three times. He received a gunshot wound to the right arm and two to the left side of the abdomen.



He informed that whilst in Guatemala he made several overnight trips to visit his common law wife and two children in Santa Elena, Cayo. He said that he turned himself in because he was tired of being on the run and also because he knew that the police were closing in on him and he did not want to be shot and possibly killed in the process of being recaptured.

Having been previously charged for the murder of Ermildo Coc, Salazar will now be charged for escape. With the accused in custody, the murder trial will now proceed.

The Central American Council of Tourism Ministers hosted its 74th Ordinary Meeting in Panama, April 21st to 23rd, 2010. The participating Belize Delegation included the Minister of Tourism, Civil Aviation & Culture, Hon. Manuel Heredia, the Director of Tourism, Seleni Matus and Marketing Officer, Jordana Riveroll.

The meetings focused on regional Marketing initiatives such as the Central American Travel Market (CATM) now in its seventh year which is being co-coordinated by host country Guatemala with the assistance of the six other Central American countries. Belize's participation is currently being organized by the BTB and the BTIA.

At the meeting, Belize's Minister of Tourism, Hon. Manuel Heredia, tabled Belize's working relationship with CATA (the Central American Tourism Agency) as the Body responsible for marketing the Central American region in Europe and Asia. The objective was to seek greater areas of collaboration with CATA in strengthening marketing efforts in the European market. As a result, CATA will be traveling to Belize shortly to meet with the Belize tourism public and private sectors in an effort to work in a more collaborative approach and to leverage our marketing investment as a destination and region.

The Meetings also provided Belize with an opportunity to present its new Director of Tourism to its Central American partners.

It also allowed them first hand to ask questions on Belize and to establish a public sector point of contact for future





enquiries for them to do business in Belize. Maya Island Regional showcased their product offering to these agents whom they have identified as their working partners to grow business opportunities in Belize.

Representing the BTB were Board member Mr. Gaspar Guerrero and Marketing Officer Lorena Martinez.

These captive presentations allow Belize to further grow its emerging markets in Central America and develop sound relationships with local Central American operators in growing future European visits through the Central American gateway.

National Sustainable Tourism Master Plan Kicks Off

A Kick-Off stakeholder workshop was held at the Radisson Fort George Hotel on Friday April 23, 2010 to conclude "Phase 0" within the development of the National Sustainable Tourism Master Plan. The workshop ended a four day tour of destinations within Belize by "Tourism and Leisure" consultants Juan Manuel Ribera (Team Leader) and Gustavo Bassotti (Project Coordinator, Sustainable Tourism Development Specialist).

Recognizing the cross-sectoral nature of the tourism industry, representatives from the private sector, multiple Government Departments, and NGOs were introduced to the mission and objectives of the project, and invited to share first-hand knowledge of the current status of the Belize tourism industry. Valuable input was provided by the stakeholders through an assessment of the strengths, weaknesses, opportunities and threats, including identification of Belize's assets and destinations for future tourism development.

Without a clear plan Mr. Bassotti stressed that Belize would experience higher negative environmental and social impacts from tourism, would not enjoy the maximum potential economic benefits, and the industry would suffer from a lack of leadership. He noted the importance of ensuring that tourism activities benefit the local residents to assure sustainability.

Following this preliminary insight into the tourism offering, for the next two months firm "Tourism and Leisure" will implement the first phase of the project involving data collection and analysis in the areas of tourism demand, supply, competitors, governance and best practice. A larger team, including a policy expert, economist and tourism physical planner will be in-country in early May

to carry out interviews, surveys and destination visits throughout the country along with local counterparts. It is envisaged that the final draft of the National Sustainable Tourism Master Plan will be completed by the end of the year, prior to the finalization of more detailed plans for San Ignacio, Belize City, Placencia Peninsula and Ambergris Caye.

The development of the National Sustainable Tourism Master Plan is a component under the Sustainable Tourism Program (STP). Funding for the US\$15million program is provided by the Government of Belize through an IDB loan, and from the Belize Tourism Board. 

he was approached by three male persons of Creole descent, one of whom was armed with what appeared as a 9 mm pistol. The armed attacker pointed the gun at him and demanded money. He reportedly remained motionless and the two other attackers

proceeded to search him. Requena was reportedly relieved of his brown leather wallet containing seven hundred dollars in cash along with his Atlantic Bank and Belize Bank ATM cards and his Social Security Card. An arrest is yet to be as investigation continues.
