#### SAN IGNACIO TOWN, Cayo, Friday, April 19, 2013:

There has been much talk, even in the news, since last Tuesday of the latest aggravated burglary, also known as a home invasion, in the west taking place at Rumors Hotel on the western outskirts of San Ignacio Town, the owners of the hotel has been informing the public that nothing is further from the truth.

While owners of the hotel are not disputing that the incident took place in the area, the establishment, they say, continues to be a safe haven for guests, customers and visiting friends. San Ignacio police informs that a massive nationwide manhunt is underway for two known convicts believed to have pulled off the brazen

#### **Wade Busted** With Twenty **Eight Pounds** Of Weed

SANTA ELENA TOWN, Cayo, Wednesday April 17, 2013:

Thirteen days after an impressive drug bust in Georgeville Village by San Ignacio Police, yet another large quantity of suspected marijuana has been intercepted, this time in Santa Elena Town Cayo.

The report reaching us indicates that just thirty minutes into the lunch hour

mid morning crime. The prime suspects, both from the Cayo District, are Marvin "Bombo" Neal, 20, Belizean laborer of an Eve Street address in Santa Elena Town and Jarod "Steal Bob" Lamb, 25, Belizean laborer residing in Ontario Village.

Police say that these two fugitives are considered armed and dangerous and that they could be hiding anywhere around the San Ignacio/Santa Elena area extending up to Belmopan and to Mahogany Heights on the George Price Highway and even as far south as Mango Creek Village.

The home invasion is said to have occurred at around 10:00 am on Tuesday, April 16 when two masked

# Attempt Rapist Remanded

#### SAN IGNACIO, Cavo, Monday, **April 15, 2013:**

A Guatemalan wonderer is today cooling his heels in jail on an attempt rape charge.

A 22 year old woman reported to San Ignacio Police that it was shortly after 7:00 pm on Saturday, April 13 as she was walking on Bullet Tree Road in San Ignacio Town when she was approached by a male Hispanic person wearing a green polo shirt, dark short pants and a white cap.

The complainant told the police that the man grabbed her by the neck and dragged her into a drain on the road side where he continued struggling with her in an effort to pull off her skirt. She resisted the attempt until another female came to her assistance and pulled her away from the aggressive

The investigation led to the arrest of Raul Dominguez, 24, Guatemalan of no fixed address. The accused was positively identified by the witness as the individual who tried to rape the woman.

Dominguez appeared in the San Ignacio Town courtroom of magistrate Narda Morgan on

armed men stormed into a private dwelling house of one of the proprietors of the hotel located about 500 yards behind the establishment.

The assailants, both of dark complexion, wearing dark clothing and with rags tied over their faces, reportedly attacked the female home owner in the laundry room. The lady was reportedly grabbed by the neck in a choke hold. During the struggle as she began grasping for breath, the face of one of the attackers was exposed and this was when one of them said that they would have to kill her because she saw the face of one of the assailants.

In an effort apparently to strangle her, a cloth was tied around her neck. They also tied her feet together, removed the jewelry she was wearing and left her on the floor inside the laundry room. They then entered the main dwelling from whence they stole a silver and black Samsung laptop computer, a grey "Blu" brand cell phone without sim card, two black female watches, a silver female watch as well as about twenty dollars in assorted coins. They then ran out of the building. The victim was hospitalized for a few days

at the Western Regional Hospital in Belmopan.

The fleeing assailants were reportedly chased on foot by a male owner of the hotel who pursued them through adjacent communities. The police did not arrive on time and the assailants eventually escaped.

The police informed that about two and a half hours after the incident, a team of policemen visited a farm in the Trapaiche area of Santa Elena where they came upon Neal and Lamb sitting on a wooden bench under a tree. Upon seeing the police they ran off and disappeared into nearby bushes. In the area, on top of the bench, the police came upon a silver and black Samsung laptop computer, a grey "Blu" brand cell phone without sim card, two black female watches, a silver female watch, seven gold looking chains, five silver looking chains, four silver bracelets and assorted pair of fashion earrings all of which were positively identified by the victim as being her property.

The items are now at the police station labelled as evidence while the nationwide manhunt continues for the two suspects.

Police believe that it is only a matter of time before the long

# Rosewood Amnesty

### BELMOPAN, Cayo, Wednesday, April 17, 2013.

A release from the Government Press Office today informed that A 'Rosewood Amnesty' was declared by the Ministry of Forestry, Fisheries and Sustainable Development on the 9th of April 2013.

The release goes on to inform that The Amnesty, which will last until April 26th, 2013, is intended to take stock of all the already cut rosewood that private individuals may have in their possession, and to approve this stock for international trade subject to the conditions of the Convention on the International Trade in Endangered Species of Wild Fauna and Flora (CITES).

The Ministry reiterates that the amnesty is only for rosewood that was

previously cut.

Several reports have been made

whereby persons have been engaging in the cutting of rosewood after the declared amnesty. The Forest Department field staff can readily recognize the difference between freshly cut and old rosewood stock.

At its meeting held on Tuesday, 16th April, 2013 Cabinet agreed that

absolutely no new illegally cut rosewood were to be allowed to be exported under the Rosewood Amnesty Program set up by the Ministry of Forestry, Fisheries and Sustainable Development.

The Forest Department is collaborating with the Police Department in Toledo to monitor this activity and further urges all partners and the general public to report on any suspected case of new rosewood cutting.

# Young Bank Now Enjoying Reliable And Safe Water Supply

Young Bank, Camalote Village, April 7, 2013:

Residents of Young Bank, a community on the outskirts of Camalote Village in the Cayo District, now enjoys quality, potable water twenty four hours a day thanks to the Government of Belize.

The official ceremony begun sharply at 3:00 p.m. with the singing of the national anthem by the gathering this was followed by an opening prayer by pastor **Gilberto Perez** while the welcome was delivered by the Camalote village chairman, **Raymond Sheppard.** 

Community leader **Miguel Aldana** gave an overview of the community over the past 13 years outlining the many struggles the community endured throughout the years every time the dry season came around.

He also spoke about the use of water containers and the many early mornings to late night deliveries of water to residents by way of a water truck. He also spoke about the many calls and trips made to Belmopan to ensure villagers a sufficient water supply. He ended by expressing gratitute on behalf of the people of Young Bank to the Governent of Belize, The Belize Water Services Limited and the Social Investment Fund for transforming the community's drean into reality.

In his remarks to the gathering, Executive Director of SIF, **Daniel Cano**, informed that approximately 470 Belizean residents, who were original immigrants from the neighboring Central American republics of Guatemala, El Salvador and Honduras will benefit from this water extension project. He said that SIF was indeed pleased to have been involved in the project. He also informed that since its inception, SIF has implemented over 500 projects on behalf of the Government of Belize

The project, which was completed last month, was implemented by SIF in collaboration with the Belize Water Services Limited (BWSL) and financed by the Government at a total cost of \$270,187.55. Of this amount, \$163,137.55 was funded through a government loan from the Caribbean Development Bank

(CDB), BWSL contributed \$100,000 and \$7,050.00 was provided by the Young Bank community as connection fees.

The Young Bank Water expansion project included the installation of almost three miles of distribution lines

to provide potable water to the entire community.

Guest speaker for the event was the Hon. Godwin Hulse, Minister of Labour, Local Government, Rural Development, Immigration and National Emergency Management. In his address Minister Hulse encouraged the residents of Young Bank to take care of the water system, to pay their water bills and to be reminded of the importance water plays in the life of a community.

In addressing the gathering, **Alberto August**, Chairman of the Belize
Water Services Limited said:

"The Belize Water Services Limited and indeed the Government of Belize recognize that investment in water infrastructure is a necessary first step in ensuring healthy communities through the provision of clean and safe water for current and future generations.

Population growth, urbanization and climate change are just three of the many challenges affecting water resources worldwide. This is compounded by the realization that while the global population currently stands at 7.5

billion, it is forecasted to reach 9 billion by the year 2050. While it has long been established that water is life, it is incumbent on the global community to ensure that water is available to the ever expanding global population.

- 2. Insist your partner be exactly the same as you. Hendrix and LaKelly Hunt say "absolute compatibility" is an express route to a dull relationship. If you insist your partner have the same feelings and perceptions as you do, it can lead to despair and misery.
- **3.** Flee from intimacy. If you habitually avoid being physically or emotionally close with your partner through escaping into work, hobbies, television, or other activities, you risk creating a divide between you and your partner that may become impossible to breach.
- 4. Play the blame game. Using "you" language when upset will make your partner put up their defenses. When your goal is to communicate in a way that fosters intimacy, use statements that begin with "I feel" instead.
- **5.** Bargain. Hendrix and LaKelly Hunt say that both **'giving conditionally** and receiving cautiously" erode relationships. They warn against doing something for a partner only when you want something in exchange.
- **6.** Be casual about romance. No relationship can be spontaneously joyful forever. Once the initial excitement of a new romance wears off, some couples think their relationship is over and give up trying. They risk missing out on experiencing a deeper kind of love.
- 7. Focus on the negative. If you constantly think and talk about your partner's flaws it can amplify your discontent. Hendrix points out that a paradox of most forms of couples therapy is that you spend your sessions complaining about your partner—something that can actually be detrimental to your relationship.
- 8. Refuse to listen. Thinking you are the right all the time and engaging in a one-way monologue is a great way to end up in a relationship...of one, warn LaKelly Hunt and Hendrix.
- 9. Hide your needs. If you don't express what you need and want to your partner, you'll constantly feel deprived and frustrated. Hendrix and LaKelly Hunt say it's crucial share "the things that truly touch your heart."
- 10. Expect a fairytale romance. Fairy tales are just that and eventually we all have to come down to earth. Demanding the fantasy go on forever prevents your partner from ever being their authentic self and fosters resentment and distance.

# **US Holds Back Recognition For**

# Venezuela's Nicolas Maduro

The US government is refusing to recognise Venezuela's President-elect **Nicolas Maduro**'s victory in disputed elections in Venezuela.

Secretary of State **John Kerry** said the US was not yet ready to validate the results of Sunday's poll.

Mr Maduro's narrow victory has been challenged by the opposition leader, **Henrique Capriles**.

Mr Capriles is insisting on a vote-by-vote recount and has now submitted a formal request for one.

However, the National Electoral Council in Venezuela has so far refused to order one, and the Supreme Court said on Wednesday that there was no legal basis for it.

Mr Kerry has supported a recount.

"Obviously, if there are huge irregularities we are going to have serious questions about the viability of that government," he told members of the House Foreign Affairs Committee.

Mr Maduro responded by accusing Washington of interfering in Venezuela's internal affairs.

He insisted: "We don't care about your recognition.

"We have chosen to be free, and

we are going to be free with or without you."

#### **Anti-US card**

He added: "The US intervention in Venezuela in recent months, and particularly during the e lection campaign, has been brutal, vulgar."

The official count indicates Mr Maduro won 50.8% of votes to Mr Capriles's 49.0%

Analysts say there is nothing new in Venezuela's official rhetoric against the United States.

The late President **Hugo Chavez** frequently criticised what he called US

imperialism.

His chosen successor, Mr Maduro, appears to be following in his footsteps.

Shortly after the death of Mr Chavez, Venezuelan officials said they would set up an inquiry to investigate suspicions that he had been murdered by foreign agencies.

Oil Minister **Rafael Ramirez** told the BBC that the United States and Israel were to blame for Mr Chavez's death.

For his part, Mr Maduro said that one day a scientific commission would prove that Mr Chavez's cancer had been "injected by imperialist forces".

He has also accused the US government of orchestrating and funding the post-election protests in co-ordination with Venezuela's opposition whom he describes as the bourgeoisie, the oligarchs.

Venezuela and the United States have not had ambassadors in each other's capitals since 2010.

#### Mexico Drops Drug Link Charges Against General Angeles

Prosecutors in Mexico say they have dropped the charges against retired general Tomas Angeles Dauahare.

Gen Angeles, a former deputy defence minister, had been accused of having links with a drug cartel.

Prosecutors said they could not corroborate allegations made by two witnesses against the general.

Shortly after the announcement, Gen Angeles was released from the maximum-security jail where he had been awaiting trial.

He had been facing charges of "organised crime to further drug-trafficking", which he had denied all along.

Two people in a witness protection programme, known under the code names of Jennifer and Mateo, had accused him of links with the Beltran Levva cartel.

#### 'False testimony'

They said Gen Angeles was tipping off cartel members about police and army operations against them in exchange for money,

Prosecutors said that they had found no convincing evidence "corroborating the testimony of the protected witnesses and no proof whatsoever which would confirm the allegations made by Jennifer and Mateo".

Jennifer was the same witness who had also accused the former anti-drugs tsar Noe Ramirez Mandujano of links with the Beltran Leyva cartel.

Mr Ramirez was cleared of the charges on Monday and released earlier on Wednesday after more than four years in prison.

The judge in that case asked for Jennifer to be investigated on suspicion of giving false testimony.

Both Mr Ramirez and Gen Angeles were investigated as part of Operation Clean-up, an attempt by former president Felipe Calderon to

eradicate corruption within the Mexican security forces.

Felipe Calderon brought in the army to fight drug cartels when he took office in 2006 and promised to be tough on any officers who were found to accept bribes by drug gangs.

But critics say drug gangs would falsely accuse officers to get rid of those who stood in their way.

# Wade Busted With Twenty Eight Pounds Of Weed

on Wednesday, April 17, 2013, a team of officers on mobile patrol on the George Price Highway in Santa Elena Town intercepted a green Toyota Camry bearing Belize City license plates # BC-C-42803 in the vicinity of Three Flags Super Store.

According to police, the occupants of the car were informed that a search was to be conducted inside the car; however nothing incriminating was found. The strong scent of marijuana prompted the officers to inform the duo that the car was to be escorted to the San Ignacio police station where a thorough search of the vehicle would be conducted. Realizing that they had been caught, the driver attempted to escape from police but was quickly subdued. In the commotion however, the single male Hispanic passenger inside the vehicle was able to run away from the scene and made good his escape.

At the station, the full examination of the green Toyota Camry revealed the name of the suspected Guatemalan national who managed to escape from the officers. The Guatemalan name was written down on a day pass provide by the Guatemalan immigration as being **Nery Hunberto**

**Leon** of neighboring Melchor de Mencos in Guatemala.

While conducting the search on the car, police reportedly uncovered 26 parcels wrapped tightly with black plastic bags inside the back passenger door panels. The drugs were subsequently showed to the driver of the car, **Barry Lee Wade**, 33, Belizean laborer of # 25 Maya Street in San Ignacio Town. Wade was informed of the offence of drug trafficking and placed under arrest.

The suspected marijuana, when weighed, tipped the scale at a staggering 12, 700.59 grams (28 pounds). Wade was then formally arrested and charged with the offence of drug trafficking.

Wade was arraigned before magistrate **Narda Morgan** on Thursday, April 18, 2013, where the

charge of drug trafficking was read to him. Followed by a not guilty plea by Wade.
